2015 Public Comment

- 2 members of the public attended to talk about re wilding and bio diversity in the village and about organising a group of volunteers to help with a new project. Parts of the presentation are mentioned below:
- "Wild About Loddiswell", is a newly formed group in the village. Currently it is just a handful of like minded individuals who have a common interest in conservation, ecology and wildlife. We will soon formalise the group by opening it to anyone from the village to join, we will have a constitution and officers will be elected etc., etc. We are very fortunate to have some very well qualified people in the fields of ecology and conservation resident in the village and to have the benefit of their knowledge and expertise.

We would like to enhance the biodiversity in and around the village, with projects such as the restoration of roadside verges and their enhancement with endemic wildflowers, and the management of Ham Butts as an area for wildlife, for the continuing use as a forest school by the primary school and for the enjoyment of the community. We are hoping that the old school field could become a heritage orchard and wildflower meadow, with a village pond (subject to agreement from DCC and with the approval of LPC and the wider community). We would also like to improve other green spaces around the village for wildlife, creating habitats and increasing connectivity by creating wildlife corridors, encouraging people to make their gardens more wildlife friendly etc.,etc.

We would also like to involve the whole community and raise their awareness of wildlife and conservation by holding events such as a Bio Blitz next summer; host evenings with a moth expert and moth trap; bat walks; talks by wildlife experts etc., etc. " end

There were mentions of a Bio Diversity Audit, fundraising events, verge cutting programs to be re considered and perhaps developed more as summer flowering verges, grass areas used more effectively and seeded with wild flower, tree planting, the old graveyard, the old school field Cllr Sheard's response was that LPC on the whole, would be happy to support however it will be an ongoing project that needs a lot of consideration before any changes are made. It was suggested that a committee is formed on behalf of the village, and the work is done by volunteers, organised by the committee, with the permission of LPC and some possible funding from both LPC, DCC and SHDC. Sincere thanks were given to the members of the

public who attended the meeting and who had clearly gone to so much trouble to produce the presentation, including meetings with SHDC, Cllr Kate Kemp, Cllr Hine and Cllr Harvey.

• Action: Clerk to contact other parishes who have paid for the Bio Diversity Audit and see if it was a good tool for them.

2016 County Cllr report - Rufus Gilbert

- There will be a conference taking place on the 24th and 25th November, which LPC councillors have been invited to attend online, discussing the South Devon Roads and plans for the next year.
- Pinch points on the B3196 were mentioned however nothing more to report. Cllr Gilbert will chase and see if a traffic survey has been completed. It was mentioned that the road was seriously congested last week during half term, as hedge trimming was taking place in Modbury, therefore closing the alternative route to Plymouth. Cllr Gilbert was asked to keep pushing forwards with this and to feed back any updates asap.
- A report was sent to LPC regarding Beechwood Park following several requests for a zebra crossing. The report can be viewed on the LPC website: <u>http://www.loddiswell.org.uk</u> under Agendas and Minutes for November. The conclusion included this paragraph:

"It should be noted that these conclusions are solely focussed n the traffic flows and the number of pedestrians crossing the road, but there are factors, such as the accident history, and the availability of any funding streams which should also be considered when determining whether any formal crossing could or should be provided". Cllr Gilbert has suggested writing to the head of Highways to discuss possible shared cost of a crossing or employing a lollipop lady.

- Clerk to look into possible funding resources
- There was a meeting at the old school field where Cllr Gilbert and Cllr Kemp discussed the possibilities of using the field as a green space for the village, not for building upon. Several ideas were mentioned including composting, however nothing will be decided at this stage.

The JLP is a fluid document created to protect and enhance our beautiful environment, as well as having to adhere to current government regulations and demands on all our communities. All the DMC (Development Management Committee) take the policies in this document into account on all planning decisions that come to committee. Community Composting

Liz Montague and I went to visit the community composting site at South Brent which is very successful and fairly straight forward. We learned that the site is open once a week and takes 3 volunteers to man. 3 cars on site at a time. The whole process is so beautifully visible that it occurred to me it would also make a good education tool for the local school.

It turns out that South Hams supply an eco-compactor, and the large vehicle required for turning the compost a few times per year. I see this as a potential solution to the problems caused to residents when the green waste service was indefinitely suspended without notice. And if anyone has a spare 1/4 acre preferably concrete. I am sure it would be productively utilised in the future.

I also found out that FCC were getting 40k per month to pick up the brown bins, which raises a few questions, such as whether they are still paying, if not where is the money...

I would also like to thank members of WAL for their learned support of the biodiverse projects already being planned for.
