2 members of the public attended from Wild About Loddisswell with an update.

- A constitution has been drafted for the group which so far, has been approved via email.
- · Bank account being set up so they can apply for grants and funding
- Official Officer election will be taking place via Zoom this week
- 47 people are supporting the group so far
- Tree planting has begun at Ham Butts and on Wednesday 2nd February, the children from Forest Schools will be planting more
- Discussions around the Old School Field being used as a Community Orchard, however this is not official and meetings will need to take place with SHDC before any details can be revealed
- · Great feedback from the local residents of Loddiswell wanting to get on board or show their support

2049 County Cllr report - Rufus Gilbert

- SW has 40% of Englands Dairy Herd
- Fertilisers are mostly manufactured using oil/gas which will hugely increase farming costs alongside energy prices
- BPS (basic payment scheme) this is gradually reducing over the next four years after Brexit and being replaced by an emphasis on environment
- UK produces 60% of its own needed produce
- Pot hole reports and repairs are continuing to fall since the Beast from the East winter. A very wet
 November and December hasn't helped. At this point, the water problem on the road from Aune Valley to
 Sorley Cross is not on Highways priority list
- Pinch Points on the Kitterford Cross Road is still being pushed and Ughborough have put in a petition to keep the pressure on getting it done. The road is crumbling along the hedgerows and cones have been

- placed to highlight the worst areas however these have mostly been run over. Cllr Gilbert will check this when he is next driving to Exeter.
- Clerk received an email from The Hoskings regarding comments over the drainage at Hatch. Clerk to forward to Cllr Gilbert, who will discuss with Highways.

2050 District Cllr report - Kate Kemp

Cllr Kemp was not present at the meeting, and will not be attending until further notice, however is still attending DM meetings and sent in a report:

- A small thatched 1930's garage has been demolished, despite attempts to protect it.
- I attended a briefing form the probation service, was Community Service and is now unpaid work order. Groups are available to help support communities with projects. The new name is Community Payback and it is all about rehabilitation and lowering the rates of re offending.

a) EV (electric vehicle) Charging ports for the village:

- A discussion was had regarding the need and installation for electric car charging ports in the village at the last meeting.
- Clerk's research questioned whether this would be an investment for the village
- Right infrastructure would need to be carefully considered so as not to 'take down' the whole village in electricity
- Need to consider how people will be charging their vehicles in 2, 5 and 10 years time
- The charging ports only have a shelf life of 10 years
- · If it was a filling station, LPC would not be subsidising it
- LPC cannot sell electricity therefore would not be able to use them as a source of income
 The idea was voted against for the time being.

- Loddiswell Show have asked LPC to fund a new BBQ. This was agreed a few years ago before Covid hit, so has been delayed. The BBQ will be for village use. Clerk to order.

- · Stopping up order is currently on hold whilst the PROW team investigate. No time frame given
